# All About Spelling Level 1 (Teacher's Manual and Student Material Packet)

Level 1 helps your child build a strong foundation for spelling. Your child will learn the sounds of the first 32 phonograms (a letter or letter combination). Next, your child will learn how to hear each individual sound in a word, how to represent each of those sounds with a phonogram, and how to apply basic spelling rules. The main focus of Level 1 is to get children comfortable and proficient with spelling short vowel words.

Letter tiles are used to demonstrate and practice reliable spelling rules. Your child will learn rules such as

- How to choose between  $\underline{c}$  and  $\underline{k}$  at the beginning of a word
- When to double f, l, and s
- How to spell /k/ at the end of a word
- How to form plural words by adding s or es
- and more!

By the end of Level One, your student will be able to write phrases such as:

the pink pig camp in tents sad songs a stiff neck big clamshell quick snack

# All About Spelling Level 2 (Teacher's Manual and Student Material Packet)

Level 2 in the All About Spelling series continues to teach reliable spelling rules and generalizations. In a practical hands-on way with lots of reinforcement and practice, your student will learn:

- The open and closed syllable types
- How to divide words into syllables
- How to spell multisyllable words
- When y can say /î/
- How Silent E can make a vowel long
